#### <u>Literacy</u>


To write a list and instructions To sequence a story To use story language Write consistently on the lines with good letter size Use different openers

Explore and talk about floating and sinking Draw a simple map from a story Know that temperature can change materials Understand the past through settings, characters and events encountered in books read in class
